

## Service Dog Animal Registration Form

An individual with a disability who uses a service animal may bring the animal to the same areas on campus where the individual may go. Titles II and III of the ADA define a service animal as any dog individually trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. No licensing or certifying entity exists to legitimize the use of a service animal. Rather, the need of the individual with a disability and the specific function the service animal (in most cases a dog) is trained to perform legitimize the use under federal and state laws.

This registration form allows the Office of Accommodations and Academic Resource Services to take appropriate measures to ensure that potential barriers are removed from housing and classroom spaces in order for the service animal to perform their tasks or work. Additionally, this will allow our office to ensure that safety checks are conducted to avoid any potential health impacts (allergies, phobias, etc.) to community members. Our office will request a picture of your service animal and a confirmation of the guidelines listed below:

1. By having access to a service animal, this means an animal: 1. Is required because of a disability 2. It has been trained to perform tasks or work related
2. If the animal is disruptive to the learning environment or college events, creates an unmanageable disturbance or interference, their presence results in a fundamental alteration of the College's program or operations, is directly aggressive or threatening, or not under the control of the handler at all times, then access to the animal may be impacted.
3. The owner assumes all responsibility for safety of the animal when entering a lab, classroom space, or other spaces at Scripps College or the Claremont Colleges.
4. Owners will assume financial responsibility and liability for any physical harm done to a person or any property damages that occur as a result of their animal.
5. Owners are responsible for the well-being of their animal. They shall not be mistreated, neglected, and appropriate health management should be in place for the animal (appropriate vaccinations, disposal of waste, managing of odors or hygiene, etc.)

If a student faces any barriers when it comes to utilizing the support of their service animal, they should immediately contact the Office of Accommodations and Academic Resource Services ([AARS@ScrippsCollege.edu](mailto:AARS@ScrippsCollege.edu)) in order to remedy the situation and find a quick resolution to their concern.
