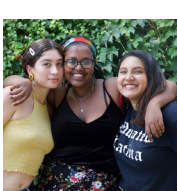
Meet Professor Arteaga and Learn about the Scripps Spanish Program

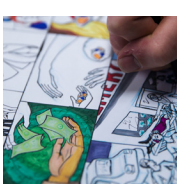

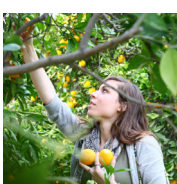
