Articulation Agreement for Transfer from Cosumnes River College to Scripps College

Women accepted for admission to Scripps College from Cosumnes River College will be eligible for junior class standing when they have completed a minimum of 64 transferable semester units. Cosumnes River College women who have maintained a B average or higher in at least 32 transferable units are encouraged to apply.

Women who earn special recognition as an **Honors Scholar** at Cosumnes River College, in addition to the minimum of 64 transferable semester units, are recognized as well-prepared and are **guaranteed priority consideration** at the junior level.

Transfer Credit Limitations

- 1. A maximum of 64 transferable semester units (equivalent to 16 Scripps courses) will be accepted from Cosumnes River College for transfer to Scripps College.
- 2. No course graded lower than "C" will be accepted for transfer.
- 3. Courses passed on a Credit/No Credit basis at Cosumnes River College will count only as elective credit toward the bachelor's degree requirements and will not meet any General Requirements or major requirements at Scripps College.
- 4. No grades of transfer courses will be used in computing the cumulative grade point average at Scripps College.
- 5. Those 300- and 400-level courses at Cosumnes River College identified in the Cosumnes River College Catalog as being transferable to the University of California (UC) without limitations and offered in academic disciplines also offered at the undergraduate Claremont Colleges (Claremont McKenna, Harvey Mudd, Pitzer, Pomona and Scripps Colleges) will be accepted as transfer credit.

Transfer credit will *not* be granted for: Agriculture; Agriculture Business; Allied Health; Animal Science; Architectural Design Technology; Architecture, except 310; Art History 300; Business, except 340, 341, 345; Communication Studies, except 311; Early Childhood Education; English as a Second Language; Family and Consumer Science; Geography, except 300/301, 310, 312, 481; Geology 345; Health Education; Horticulture; Human/Career Development; Journalism; Library; Mathematics 341, 344, 350, 351; Music Performance; Nutrition; Physical Education and Athletics (Adapted, Dance, Fitness, Personal Activities, Sports, Team Activities, or Physical Education Theory); Plant Science; Psychology 312, 320, 335, 351, 356, 360, 365, 372 (unless 300 previously completed with grade of C or higher); Radio, Television and Film Production, except 300, 305; Theatre Arts, except 460, 476.

- 6. No transfer credit will be accepted from a Cosumnes River College transcript for credit earned by examination or military experience. Transfer credit for Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and CLEP will be considered separately as defined in the Scripps College catalog.
- 7. Applicability of transfer credit to meet requirements in the student's major will normally be limited to introductory courses and will normally be considered only as prerequisite to the major.
- 8. Transfer credit earned as semester units at Cosumnes River College will be converted to Scripps College courses based upon one semester unit being equivalent to one fourth (.25) Scripps course. One Scripps course is equivalent to four semester units. Any individual Cosumnes River course equivalent to three semester units or more may be considered to meet a specific requirement at Scripps.

Applicability of Cosumnes River College Courses towards Scripps College General Education Requirements

ENGWR 300 required; ENGWR 301 strongly recommended.

First-Year Writing Requirement

Transfer students will be placed into the Core sequence based upon their class standing at entrance. Students who transfer with the equivalent to 4 or fewer Scripps courses will begin with Core I and complete the 3-course sequence. Students who transfer with the equivalent to 5-8 courses will complete Core II and III. Students who transfer as first-semester sophomores (8-12 courses) must complete only Core III. Transfer students entering Scripps with the equivalent of 12 or more Scripps courses will be waived from the Core Curriculum requirement.

Core Curriculum in Interdisciplinary Humanities

Fine Arts: One 3-unit transferable course from Art or Art New Media (but not Art History), Music, Photography; or Theatre Arts; and Letters: One 3-unit transferable course from Art History, English Literature, or Philosophy (except 320); and Natural Sciences: One transferable course with laboratory from: Anthropology 300/301; Astronomy 300/400; Biology 307, 310, 400-440, 481; Chemistry 305-308, 321/322, 332, 400-421; Geography 300/301; Geology 300/301, 305/306, 310/311; Physical Science 302; Physics 350, 370, 411; Physical Science 302; and Social Sciences: One 3-unit transferable course from Anthropology

Breadth of Study (one course in each of four areas)

(except Anthropology 300/301), Economics; History; Political

Science; Psychology; Social Science; or Sociology.

One of the following 3-course sequences: Sign Language 305, 306 and 315 (316 highly recommended); or Spanish 401, 402 and 411 (412 highly recommended); or Vietnamese 401, 402, 411 (412 highly recommended). Foreign Language (Competency equivalent to completion of at least three semesters and intermediate level)

One course from among: Math 370 (or higher level Calculus course); Statistics 300; or Philosophy 325.

Mathematics

One course from among: English Literature 360; History 331; or Psychology 356 (if preceded by Psychology 300 with a grade of C or higher.)

Gender and Women's Studies Requirement

One 3-unit transferable course from among the following: Anthropology 334, Native Peoples of North America; English Literature 330, African American Literature; History 320 or 321, History of the United States: African-American Emphasis; Social Science 325, Asian Experience in America, or 330, Mexican-Americans in the United States. Race and Ethnic Studies Requirement
